And so I just kept getting yeses and yeses and yeses. And then I flew to meet the judges in person, and I got to sing in front of them. Katy Perry, Lionel Richie, Luke Bryan. And it was such a surreal experience. I walked in so confidently, and as soon as I walked in, I got dry mouth, and I was just like, Oh, my goodness. I was like, they're just people. They're just people, but they do not look like just people. They look like walking Barbies. Sure. And you know, it's just it's showbiz. It's so it's, it's not for it's not just for anyone, and you just have to it's very cutthroat. That's really what I'm trying to say. It's super cool, bro. I sang for them. And they loved my voice. But yet there I didn't get a yes. I got a yes from Lionel Richie. Katy Perry said I was too nervous in the beginning, which it is a nerve nerve wracking experience. We're just like, we're trying to figure out who you are. And in that season, I didn't know who I was, either. And so I had to experience disappointment. But God was building me up and showing me who I was. And I had to go through a really tough season. But I'm so grateful. I went through that because God spoke identity over me. And I was his daughter first. And, you know, and so, yeah, I'm really grateful for that experience.

But I, my best friend ended up taking me to church and I just felt like the Lord really met me in church in a worship service, and through the sermon, and God was just building me back up and I was reading a book by one of my favorite authors, Jenny Allen. She's a speaker Pastor, and her book really resonated. With the season that I was in, and it's called, the book is called "Get Out of Your Head". And so I remember going through the season of just putting God first in every part of my life. And music used to be an idol for me, actually, it was everything for me. And this dream, and this gift was everything for me. But I had to lay it down because I was no longer fulfilled in it. And I remember my mom told me, and I think I read it in the Bible, too. I don't just read set songs or anything like that, but just a song that meets someone in their season and points them back to Jesus. Because Christian music has been that for me, I was the girl that listen to Christian radio, my mom would play it in the morning, taking me to school, picking me up from school, worship music, always playing in the in the house. And I had no idea what all of that would do to me. But really, my mom was constantly inviting God's presence in the car or in the house is that's truly what it was.
